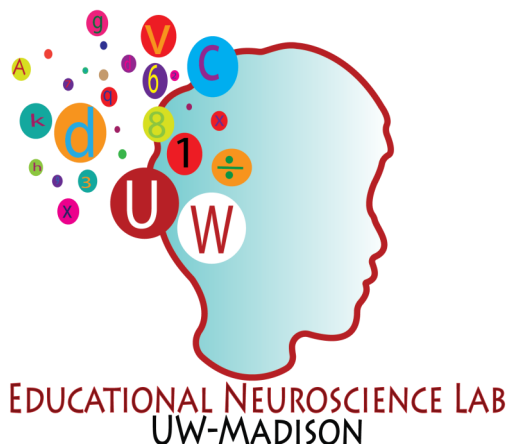


Is your child in 6th grade and a fluent English speaker?
