Dear Parent or Guardian of a 2016-2017 Incoming 9th grader,

The Middleton Cross Plains Area School District would like to welcome you and your current 8th grade student to the district and also make you aware of upcoming Middleton High School and Clark Street Community School informational presentations in January.

Your "Class of 2020" student will have the option of attending either Middleton High School (MHS) or applying to attend Clark Street Community School (CSCS). Whereas MHS is a comprehensive high school with a wide array of course offerings, CSCS is a progressive high school focused on personalized, place-based education with a commitment to democratic participation. MHS Counselors and CSCS staff will be facilitating presentations at our middle schools in early January to share course selection information. Private school students are welcome to attend the presentations at either location at a time that is most convenient for them.

Private school students are welcome to attend programs at Kromrey Middle School **OR** Glacier Creek Middle School. The same information will be shared at both locations – select the date and time that is most convenient for you. In mid-December, we will be sending the private schools a link to a registration video. We encourage students to view the video prior to attending the January 7th or 8th presentation.

Please have your student check in at the Main office of the building when they arrive at the selected middle school and they will be directed to the meeting.

Information sessions at CSCS will be held 11/23/15, 12/10/15 & 1/13/16, from 6:30-8:00 pm at Clark Street Community School and 1/9/16, from 10-11:30 am. Interested families may choose to attend any of these sessions.

Honors Placement Information:

In an effort to make the best possible placements, all private school students will be asked to submit standardized placement test scores for both English and Math, along with a completed teacher recommendation rubric for both subject areas (Checklist and Teacher Rubrics enclosed)

After review, each student will be informed of the placement recommendation for both English and Math, which may include recommendation for **Honors English 9** or **Honors Mathematics**. Students who do not have standardized test scores should contact Ms. Genthe as soon as possible to discuss placement options. **All placement materials, including test scores, rubrics and completed checklist should be returned to Middleton High School by December 11, 2015.**

Middleton High School Course registration begins Thursday, January 7, 2016, and runs through Wednesday, January 20, 2016. All course selections are due Middleton High School, Student Services Office, **and Wednesday, January 20, 2015.**

Students planning on attending Middleton High School for the 2016-2017 school year are asked to register prior to submitting their course selections as Counselors are unable to input your course selections until you are enrolled through the Middleton Cross Plains Area School District's central office.
