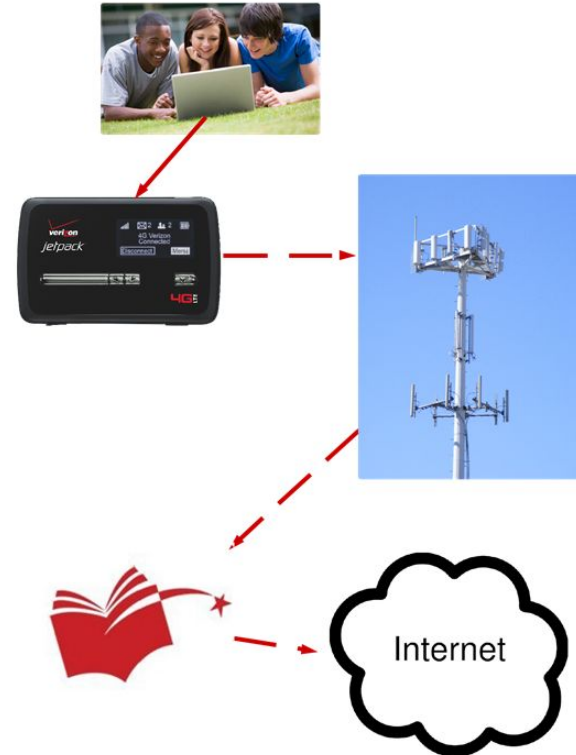




Technology Access for All: Take the Internet Home
