Hello MCPASD families,

Thank you for staying up-to-date with all the communication being sent to you about our ever-changing environment. We recognize it is a lot, and on top of your own work and personal considerations. Thank you!

First, we want to remind you all Middleton-Cross Plains Area schools are closed and that closure extends minimally through Sunday, April 5. This includes all 4K-12 student instruction and extra-curricular activities. We continue to prioritize the many important things we need to communicate to our families, so we appreciate your attention to details we are regularly sharing. Expect further updates.

1. Do you need to get into your child’s school to pick up medications?

Families will have the opportunity to get essential medications at the following times:

- Tuesday, March 17: 7 to 11 a.m. or 3 to 7 p.m.

Medication can only be picked up by a parent/guardian listed in Infinite Campus. Please enter the main entrance of each school. If you can’t make it on Tuesday, please contact your school principal.

2. Does your child or children need a Chromebook for virtual learning?

If you filled out our survey and indicated your child needs a Chromebook or told staff at a particular school, students can pick up Chromebooks:

- Tuesday, March 17: 7 to 11 a.m. or 3 to 7 p.m. (every District school)

If you have a child at more than one school, you will need to visit each of their schools to pick up a device. We apologize for the inconvenience.

We are finalizing plans to provide online instruction, and the earliest that would begin is March 30. If you also need internet access and indicated so on the survey, MiFi devices will be available later this week. We will communicate at a later date about distribution. You can also get free internet access from Charter.

3. Will other students be able to access schools on Tuesday?

We strongly encourage other students not to come to school to gather personal belongings.

4. Will meals be provided while schools are closed?

Free breakfasts and lunches will be available for all students ages 18 and under on a grab-and-go basis from 11 a.m. to noon on weekdays starting Tuesday, March 17 through Friday, April 3 (including spring break) at the following locations:

There is no registration involved and children don't need to provide their names. Please look for an MCPASD yellow bus at each site. Children cannot take extra meals for siblings or friends. If your child is allergic to peanut butter or other foods, please have them tell the individuals distributing the meals.

We also strongly encourage practicing social distancing when picking up meals and thorough hand-washing with soap and water before eating the take-home meals.

During the time of school closure (March 16 to April 5), the following conditions apply:

- All District-sponsored events (concerts, performances, etc.) and out-of-District field trips are postponed or canceled.
- All sports and other extracurricular practices and competitions are postponed or canceled.
- All District facilities are closed for use by internal or external groups. This includes any individual or group that had previously reserved space in our buildings/grounds during this closure period.

Donations: We have had families ask if we have a need for school supplies, food or financial donations as we strive to help those families who may need assistance in a home learning environment. If you have extra supplies or would like to financially help, please reach out to [Middleton Outreach Ministry](#) or the [MCPASD Education Foundation](#). Each is a great partner with the District and ready to help.

Please know that if you are seeking social-emotional or mental health support for your child, we encourage you to reach out to your child's student services team. All student services staff are available by email Monday through Friday -- excluding spring break -- and will respond as quickly as possible.
