MCPASD has been the fastest-growing district in Dane County for the past 4 years.



MCPASD is expected to grow by about 2,000 students over the next decade.



**JUST IN!** The MCPASD tax mill rate has dropped by 17% over the past five years.



**JUST IN!** The MCPASD tax levy for 2018-19 dropped by more than 1.8%.

# WHAT WILL BE ON THE NOVEMBER 6 BALLOT?



## QUESTION #1

### INCREASE CAPACITY AND UPGRADE FACILITIES

\$138.9 MILLION

- Build a new elementary school adjacent to Pope Farm Conservancy
- Renovate and expand Middleton High School (MHS); Clark Street Community School (CSCS) will be included in the new high school construction
- Add a cafeteria and renovate Park Elementary School
- Convert the current CSCS building into an Early Learning Center

## QUESTION #2

### EXCEED CURRENT REVENUE LIMIT FOR OPERATIONS

\$4.8 MILLION/YEAR\*

- Includes staffing costs and other operational expenses associated with new and expanded facilities, technology upgrades, safety and security upgrades, and equipment
- \$4.8 million for 2020-21 school year and thereafter

*\*Exception is Year 1 (2019-20), which will be a reduced cost of \$2.8 million*
